Consider Accessibility—Online and In-Person

- ✓ Offer class descriptions that include intensity level and props used
- Add captions to online video content
- Make sure your entrance, bathrooms, and website navigation are physically and cognitively accessible

Need a deeper audit? Ask a few trusted clients what felt intimidating the first time they came in. Their insights are gold.

Representation is a Form of Invitation

Make sure your visuals reflect a range of people.

- ✓ Use marketing materials that reflect the diversity of your actual or ideal clientele
- Feature testimonials or photos from a mix of clients
- Spotlight different teaching styles and instructors in your team

People want to see themselves reflected. Representation isn't just inspiring—it's *effective*.

The bottom line? Inclusivity isn't about doing everything perfectly.

It's about choosing to be thoughtful, approachable, and open...and being willing to keep learning.
